The Japanese Model of economic development will be introduced, including the industrial structure, public finance, monetary policy, and financial systems. It starts from the Edo era of Japan. After the introduction on the economic development in Meiji period, the high-speed development of the Japanese economy after World War II will be covered. Then some business practices in the Japanese Model will be introduced and discussed. Finally we will discuss the current social and economic situations in Japan. Additionally, students will develop teamwork skills through classroom group discussions. Students will also develop personal and social responsibility through real examples in the course.
