Curriculum Policy	<p><b>Educational Overview</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>By enrolling in language courses (English for Academic Excellence and Japanese Language Program), Foundation Courses, and certain courses from each subject area, students will attain the foundation for acquiring the abilities set forth in the YGU DP and the ICLA DP.</li> <li>Students will acquire the ability to think critically, creatively, and globally, and to work collaboratively to solve problems through cross-disciplinary and intensive learning in the fields of Global Business and Economics, Political Science, Psychology, Interdisciplinary Data Science, Interdisciplinary Arts, and Japan Studies.</li> </ul> <p><b>Methodology</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Through each subject area, classes will be conducted using active learning methods such as discussion, presentation, debate, and other methods, in order to convey knowledge and skills as well as to develop the ability to apply them in both Lecture and Seminar class styles.</li> <li>In Workshops, students will learn through planning, proposing, demonstration, creation, and production of work in each field to foster creativity, initiative, and expression.</li> </ul> <p><b>Evaluation Methods</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>In Lecture and Seminar courses for each subject area, not only is the retention of knowledge and skills measured, but also the ability to apply knowledge and skills evaluated through oral presentation or written works (or both).</li> <li>In Workshops, students will be assessed through behavioral evaluation from their ability to execute projects, and performance evaluation from instructional outcomes.</li> <li>Evaluation criteria for each class will be defined by the syllabus and the rubric.</li> <li>Graduation is assessed according to the criteria specified in the Regulations for the International College of Liberal Arts Course of Study.</li> </ul>																												
Admissions Policy	<p>We seek individuals:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>who are motivated and enthusiastic</li> <li>who have academic potential and an adequate level of academic accomplishment</li> <li>who have a tolerant and curious mind, and possess critical and flexible thinking</li> <li>who have English proficiency at the level needed to pursue studies at ICLA, and English language learning ability</li> </ul> <p>Basic knowledge and skills: Students are required to have a high school level of English language proficiency at the time of admission, as almost all courses are taught in English. In addition, students are required to have basic knowledge of language, mathematics, science, civics, and geography and history in order to take a wide range of liberal arts courses.</p> <p>Ability to think, judge, and express oneself: Individuals who have critical, creative, independent, and global thinking skills, and the ability to express their thoughts appropriately in English and Japanese.</p> <p>Independence, diversity, and collaboration: Individuals who are curious about different cultures and highly motivated to work with people from diverse cultural backgrounds to solve common problems in order to play an active role in international society.</p>
